
# ARRA-SQUARED

As you may know, pirates are statistically correlated with global warming. Need help with the clues? The numbers in black circles refer to specific clue types listed on the Cryptic Clues Primer reference sheet you received.





- 1. They have ten ships in four different sizes, as depicted below.
- 2. Each card encodes a different deployment of this fleet to the same area, by somehow telling us how many ship segments are in each row and column.
- 3. Each ship has one or more pennants that it flies no matter where it's deployed. These pennants are shown on the ships below.
- 4. Within one deployment, no two ships will ever be adjacent to each other, even diagonally.

If you can figure out these two fleet deployments, we may be able to find their hidden treasures by seeing which sites they make sure are guarded.
