


Cros-Walk

The two streets named in the acrostic are BROADWAY and HOLLAND; their intersection is the center of Teele Square in Somerville, so the answer is **TEELE**. Solvers without knowledge of Somerville geography can nonetheless find Teele Square on the map of Somerville pictured in clue F; failing that, they can walk a half mile to find that intersection.
