HELPFUL INFORMATION

This is a variant of a puzzle known as a **barred dropquote**. The letters above each column are "dropped" into the column (in some order) to spell out words. In this particular puzzle, the heavy lines indicate breaks between words.

Words may be split across lines – for example, the first line ends with the first two letters of a word, and the next line begins with the last three letters of that same word. As an aid to solving, the words in the dropquote grid are in alphabetical order. (However, the clues are not in order.)

(Note: You may notice that there are six letters in each column but only five rows. That's not a mistake!)
