All of the yellow words can be rolled from a set of four dice if the letters on each die are:

- A, D, F, L, T, and Y
- B, J, K, S, W, and Z
- C, G, I, M, R, and V
- E, H, N, O, P, and U

All of the red words can be rolled from a set of four dice if the letters on each die are:

- A, B, J, O, P, and X
- C, D, N, Q, R, and S
- E, F, G, I, L, and U
- H, K, M, T, V, and Y

All of the **blue** words can be rolled from a set of four dice if the letters on each die are:

- A, G, M, N, O, and V
- B, I, L, T, X. and Z
- C, E, F, P, S, and Y
- D, H, K, R, U, and W

The overlaid letters presented at the bottom of the puzzle can be decoded by looking up each pair of letters in the respective sets of dice, and finding a third letter which is present on the same dice those two letters are present on. For example, the first pair contains a red J and a yellow Z. The red die with a J also contains the letter A, B, O, P and X, while the yellow die with a Z also contains B, J, K, S and W. The third letter present on both dice is therefore B. Decoding the entire string of overlaid letters in this way leads to the hazard: BACKFIRING BOOBY TRAPS.

The puzzle title contains six letters which are presented in orange, green, and purple. If the color orange is separated into red and yellow, the color green is separated into blue and yellow, and the color purple is separated into Oscar nominations red and blue, there are now letter pairs which can be decoded in a similar fashion. For example, interpreting the purple R in the puzzle title as a red R and a blue R, the letters on the red die with the R (C, D, N, Q, S) and the blue die with the R (D, H, K, U, W) have only the letter D in common. Decoding the title in this way leads to the password: DAFTLY.
